40 years ago: Category was Animals. Winners were Glen Warren (slides), Stephen Benjamin (color prints) and Larry Morgan (b/w prints); judge was Paul Schuhmann ... Program featured a 16mm movie, "Kentucky's Feathered Rainbow," from the state Fish and Wildlife department.

35 years ago: Category was Bridges.

Winners were Stuart Hendershot (slides), Jack Diehl (color prints) and John Baxter (b/w prints); judge was Jerry Spanyer ... Adam Jones presented a program on nature photography.

**30 years ago:** Category was What Is It? Winners were Ron Bailey (slides), Corette Wolford (color prints) and Bob Wells (b/w prints); judge was Bill Ogden ... Speaker was Dr. Gene Burch, a dentist from Frankfort who has produced a calendar of Frankfort images ... LPS member Linda Morton's black and white photo was chosen for the Kentucky Moments III exhibit sponsored by the Frankfort Arts Foundation and the Frankfort Camera Club. The exhibit opened this month at the State Capitol, then traveled the state for one year to libraries throughout Kentucky.

**25 years ago:** Category was Bridges. Winners were Deborah Brownstein (color prints), Bob Dorzback (b/w prints) and Fred Engelmann (slides); judge was Brian Bohannon ... Program was a slide show on Spain from Al and Terry Boice. ... The annual showcase was at Bashford Manor Mall in the old Walden Bookstore site near Dillard's on March 18-19 ... Deborah Brownstein elected LPS president. ... 20 years ago: Category was Candlelight. Winners were Patty Colston (color prints), T.Y. Huang (b/w prints) and Fred Engelmann (slides); judge was Mary Ann Buckner ... Sandy Nabb and Al Boice presented a short program on Photoshop.

#### THIS MONTH IN LPS HISTORY



The eighth and next-to-last LPS Showcase was held 25 years ago on March 18-19, 2000, at Bashford Manor Mall. Coordinated by Dr. Ron Lehocky, the Showcases displayed dozens of member shots in an empty storefront and more in scrapbooks, featured a group slide show and often a rotating program of member slide shows. Members gave demonstrations and instructional talks and photo advice to mallgoers who happened by. The Showcases were a major recruiting tool and attracted many new members. **15 years ago:** Category was Objects in Repetition. Winners were Ted Heitzman (digital), Ken Tripp (monochrome prints), Al Wollerton (color prints) and Jan Hamiilton (novice); judge was April Rietze ... Program was by Kevin Laundroche, who shared his self-publishing experience with club members.

10 years ago: Category was Americana. Winners were Ken Tripp (digitals), Steve Cowherd (color prints), Deborah Brownstein (monochrome prints) and Deborah Hennessey (novice); judge was Nathan Cornetet ... Speakers were Kevin and Stephanie Turner with images from their three-week, cross-country motorcycle trip the past summer. ... Year-end winners: David Becker (color print points, digital points), John Holthaus (monochrome points, best monochrome), Stephanie Turner (novice points), Greg Miller (color print), Steve Cowherd (digital image), Deborah Hennessey (best novice image), Deborah Brownstein (photo book) ... LPS board member Eric Link, who developed the club's digital competition and was a State Fair judge for several years, died March 16.

Five years ago: Category was Rule of Thirds. Advanced winners were Bob Dorzback (digitals) and Greg Miller (color and monochrome prints); amateur winners were Leigh Anne Logsdon (digital and color prints) and Kyle Shepherd (mono prints); judge was Cindy Rice Shelton ... It was the first meeting at Thomas Jefferson Unitarian Church (now All Peoples), the last meeting and contest (because of Covid) until a Zoomed get-together in June, and the last in-person meeting until September 2021. Contests remained all-digital until January 2022 ... Program was an "inaugural biographical address" by new president Kevin Laundroche ... Member David Kelm won the Literary LEO black/white photo contest.

#### ABOUT THE LOUISVILLE PHOTOGRAPHIC SOCIETY

Membership in LPS is open to everyone. You must be a paid member of LPS to submit photos for competition. There are two divisions of competition, Amateur and Advanced, and three categories in each division, Color Prints, Monochrome Prints, and Digital submissions. No more than two entries are allowed per category, and you may enter in only one division each month. Digital images must be submitted **no later than two weeks before the meeting** and must be no larger than 2 MB, with no more than 2000 pixels on the long side at a resolution of no higher than 120 DPI.

You MUST compete at the Advanced level if:

- · You are a professional photographer (you earn more than 50% of your annual income from photography).
- · You have had a juried gallery showing.
- · If you are an accomplished photographer and are not in the above groups, you are encouraged to enter at the Advanced level.






